2022 HIGHLIGHTS

Our EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR Rachel was named a 2022 L'ORÉAL PARIS WOMEN OF WORTH HONOREE! Project Libertad received a \$20,000 grant to support our mission, and HBO Max produced a DOCUMENTARY about our work. - WE Launched the <u>JÓVENES FUERTES:</u> <u>STRONG YOUTH PROGRAM</u> in partnership with <u>IMMIGRANT PSYCHOLOGY NETWORK</u>. Jóvenes Fuertes is a culturally-responsive socialemotional learning (SEL) program created by a Latinx immigrant psychologist to **SUPPORT THE MENTAL HEALTH OF LATINX NEWCOMERS** in schools. The program is offered in collaboration with partner school districts and focuses on teaching newcomer students social and emotional skills, promoting resilience, strengthening assets, and increasing coping skills.
- We launched JUNTOS PARA JÓVENES: UNITED
 FOR YOUTH, a project that PROVIDES DIRECT
 CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES to newcomer immigrant youth and their families in Montgomery

County, PA, who are experiencing barriers to their self-sufficiency, in order to meet a variety of their basic needs that have been caused and/ or exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. These needs include, but are not limited to: mental health treatment, lack of health insurance, food insecurity, housing insecurity, landlord/tenant issues, and immigration legal services.

- We launched a BOYS' HEALTHY MASCULINITY PROGRAM for newcomer youth in Phoenixville!
- We awarded the second annual PROJECT LIBERTAD SCHOLARSHIP to NATHALY, a member of our Immigrant Youth Advisory Team!



- We grew to a staff of four people, up from just one staff member in January 2022! Our team now includes our Executive Director, Volunteer Coordinator, Newcomer Support Program Coordinator, and Case Manager, as well as our dedicated volunteer team!
- We hosted an <u>EQUAL JUSTICE AMERICA</u> <u>LEGAL FELLOW</u>, <u>JESSICA ARANA</u>, who worked on legal cases for children in our <u>IMMIGRANT</u> <u>CHILDREN'S DEFENSE PROJECT!</u>
- Our RISE GIRLS' EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM VISITED CABRINI UNIVERSITY, where they enjoyed touring the beautiful campus and met with bilingual guides to discover what Cabrini has



to offer. Afterwards, many of the girls expressed excitement about the possibilities ahead.

immediately, so I decided to work with him every day of camp. We had one-on-one lessons during our ESL activity; he was a fast learner and motivated. He enjoyed camp and seemed much happier. We kept up with weekly lessons after camp, and he continued to do well. Now back at school, he is having a much better time than last year; his teachers say he is an excellent student and even a leader amongst his peers. Miguel frequently expresses that he is appreciative for the help. He has even volunteered at after-school events with us representing Project Libertad. We are both grateful to know each other, and as an added bonus my Spanish has greatly improved from learning together!

LEGAL-MENTAL HEALTH PARTNERSHIP

Thanks to our **LEGAL-MENTAL HEALTH PARTNERSHIP** with **IMMIGRANT PSYCHOLOGY NETWORK** funded by **PA IS READY!**:

- 323 INDIVIDUALS received free mental health and wellness presentations
- The project supported partner school districts with TRAUMA-INFORMED TRAINING for educators and consultation for high-risk students.
- IPN provided Project Libertad youth clients with PSYCHOLOGICAL EVALUATIONS to support their immigration legal cases.



NEWCOMER SUPPORT PROGRAMS

- Our Newcomer Support Programs served
 232 STUDENTS across six schools in two school districts. These programs create a SAFE SPACE for newcomers to adapt to life in the United States and process their EXPERIENCE OF MIGRATION.
- Our SUMMER 2022 NEWCOMER SUPPORT
 PROGRAM grew to serve 37 STUDENTS and expanded to run three days per week (up from just 11 students and one day per week in 2021)!



- RISE: Refugee and Immigrant Students Excelling Girls' Empowerment Program:
 - 39 IMMIGRANT AND REFUGEE GIRLS
 participated in this GIRLS' EMPOWERMENT
 PROGRAM funded by the VALENTINE
 FOUNDATION.
- We launched a BOYS' HEALTHY MASCULINITY PROGRAM for newcomer youth in Phoenixville, serving about 30 youth weekly.
- We hired a part-time Newcomer Support Program Coordinator!

JUNTOS PARA JÓVENES: UNITED FOR YOUTH PROGRAM

- We launched JUNTOS PARA JÓVENES: UNITED FOR YOUTH, A PROJECT THAT PROVIDES DIRECT CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES TO NEWCOMER IMMIGRANT YOUTH AND THEIR FAMILIES in Montgomery County, PA, who are experiencing barriers to their self-sufficiency, in order to meet a variety of their basic needs that have been caused and/or exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. These needs include, but are not limited to: mental health treatment, lack of health insurance, food insecurity, housing insecurity, landlord/tenant issues, and immigration legal services.
- We hired our FULL-TIME CASE MANAGER!
- We served 13 CHILDREN from October to December 2022 and made 23 REFERRALS FOR SOCIAL SERVICES.
